Dear Chris Brown:

Your complaint against the Ottawa-Carleton Regional Transit Commission dated July 28, 1991 alleging discrimination in the provision of services because of disability is being presented to the Commission for a decision not to deal with pursuant to sub-paragraph 41(c), because the service to which the complaint relates is not a service customarily available to the general public within the meaning of section 5 of the Act. The Commission may decide to accept, change, or reject this recommendation.


For your information, I have enclosed a copy of the materials which will be presented to the Commission for its review. You are entitled to submit your comments to the Commission for review when it considers the report. If you wish to do so, send your submission to me at the address noted below.

Your submission must arrive within thirty (30) days of the date you receive this letter. This 30 day time limit will be strictly adhered to in order to expedite the completion of this complaint. Material received more than 30 days after receipt of this letter may, therefore, not be presented to the Commission when a decision is made.

You will be advised of the Commission's decision after it has reviewed the report.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that the Commission, subsequent to reaching a decision, may decide to use this complaint for educational or publicity purposes. If you have any objections to this, either contact me or include your concerns with respect to publicity in your submission.
